Re: Sponsor Money

Dear Participants:

For this year's mission work in our local area, culminating in our annual Journey to Appalachia, you need to raise \$300.00 in sponsor money. **The entire \$300.00 is due by the Sunday of the February Pancake Breakfast.**

If Steve Hearne does not receive, in hand, your first \$300.00 by that date, you will lose your spot on the trip.

It is important to remember that more youth have signed on for this year's trip than there are available spots. In the past, the situation has resolved itself through the attrition of students with conflicting commitments to summer camps, family vacations, or loss of interest. That may not happen this year. **The final selection of who will go on this year's trip will be based upon your point accumulation earned by your participation in our fund-raising, work training, pancake breakfasts, singing at the contemporary services. Final selection will occur at our Final Meeting in May.**

Money without a sponsor form will not count. You may deliver your sponsor's money to Steve Hearne at his home (1522 Woodland Road), his office (105 W. Main Street, 2nd Floor), or Asbury Church. Steve's home phone is 410-546-3514, work phone is 410-860-6606, and Asbury's is 410-749-2131.

Checks must be made payable to "A.S.P." or "Asbury Service Project". If any of your sponsors are mailing a check to the church, be sure to tell them to make out the check as indicated. Most of your sponsors will be members of Asbury. If they send a check to Asbury that is made payable to Asbury without any designation for ASP (or your name or a Sponsor Form), the money will be treated as a donation to the church and not be counted as a donation to ASP.

Please do not go to your parents for money. Many members of the church look forward to the opportunity to join in our ministry through their contributions.
